MEMBERS PRESENT: Mayor Stephen J. Wukela called the regular meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with the following members present: Councilman Frank J. Brand, II; Councilman Steve Powers; Councilman Edward Robinson; Councilman Billy D. Williams; Councilman William C. Bradham, Jr.; and Councilwoman Octavia Williams-Blake.

ALSO PRESENT: David N. Williams, City Manager; Dianne M. Rowan, Municipal Clerk; James W. Peterson, Jr., City Attorney; Phillip Lookadoo, Director of Urban Planning & Development; Thomas Chandler, Director of Finance and Tom Shearin, Special Services Administrator.

Notices of this regular meeting were sent to the media informing them of the date, place and time of the meeting. Dwight Dana of the Morning News was present for the meeting.

INVOCATION

Mayor Pro tem Billy D. Williams gave the invocation, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilman Brand made a motion to adopt the minutes of the regular meeting of June 14, 2010. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

SPECIAL HONORS AND RECOGNITIONS

Citizen of the Month

Mr. George Scipio was recognized by Councilman Billy D. Williams as the Citizen of the Month for June, 2010.

Special Recognition

Councilman Robinson requested a moment of silence in remembrance of Mr. Lawrence Smith, a well known political leader in the City of Florence, who passed away on July 10, 2010.

Retirement Recognition

Mayor Wukela presented Mrs. Liz Shaw with a plaque recognizing her recent retirement from the City of Florence. Mrs. Shaw was employed with the City from July 1987 through March 2010.

Service Recognitions

Mayor Wukela presented David Williams a certificate in recognition of completing 25 years of service with the City of Florence.

Mr. Leroy James received a certificate in recognition of completing 35 years with the City of Florence.

Mrs. Marshell McKever was presented a certificate by Mayor Wuklea recognizing 25 years of service with the City.

Amy Pressley, David McClure, Michael Ard, Isiah Samuel, Danny Camlin and Lois Harrell, each received a certificate from Mayor Wukela recognizing their 20 years of service with the City of Florence.

Mayor Wukela presented Ronnie Ellerbee a certificate recognizing 15 years of service with the City.

Van Jackson received a certificate from Mayor Wukela recognizing 10 years of service with the City of Florence.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS (TAKEN OUT OF ORDER)

A RESOLUTION OF RECOGNITION FOR MRS. CLEO MYERS KELLY REQUESTED BY COUNCILMAN BILLY D. WILLIAMS.

Councilman Williams made a motion to adopt the Resolution of Recognition for Mrs. Cleo Myers Kelly. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Councilman Williams presented a Resolution of Recognition to the family of Mrs. Cleo Myers Kelly, who turned 100 years old on July 12th. Mrs. Kelly celebrated her birthday with family and friends on Saturday, July 10th.

APPERANCES BEFORE COUNCIL

Mrs. Vermelle Simmons, Partnership Specialist U.S. Census

Mrs. Simmons thanked Council for their help and support with the 2010 Census. At present South Carolina is ranking 23rd in the nation in the mail back participation as compared with ranking 49th in 2000. Florence County is up four percentage points from 67% in the 2000 Census to 71% in the 2010 Census. The City of Florence is actually down one percentage point from 74% to 73%. However, this figure will improve in the fall when a quality assurance check is performed.

Mr. Ed Love, Chairman, Florence County Legislative Day

Mr. Love, Chairperson for the Florence County Legislative Day Committee, thanked Council on behalf of Florence County Progress and Florence County Economic Development Partnership, for their participation in the 2010 Legislative Day that was held in Columbia on March 23, 2010.

In response to Councilman Robinson's question of what economic advantage Legislative Day is to the City of Florence, Mr. Love stated that Florence County Legislative Day is a major step in the direction of showcasing Florence County and the City of Florence as the hub of the Pee Dee, and to show the Legislators that the dollars they have been kind enough to give the City of Florence have been well spent. Legislative Day gives the rest of the state a chance to see what Florence has brought in.

Mr. Michael Hawkins, Parks and Beautification Commission

Mr. Hawkins appeared before Council and thanked them for the funds that have been allocated for improvements at Levy Park and for their continued support of Levy Park. Mr. Hawkins gave each member of Council a piece of the original basketball court from Levy Park as a keepsake.

Mrs. Janice Baroody, Executive Director, PDRTA

Mrs. Baroody appeared before Council to request a letter of support for a grant that PDRTA is planning to submit to the Federal Transit Administration for the purpose of building a transit hub. The grant's program is TIGER (Transit Investments in Generating Economic Recovery), Phase II. The project would be a multi-modal facility which would include transit facilities, a business incubator, a possible link with Southeastern Stages, the possibility of public/private partnerships with other merchants in the general area, and a place to stage their buses. Contact has been made with Amtrak about the possibility of partnering with them as well. Mrs. Baroody stated PDRTA is looking for an endorsement of a project they anticipate will bring economic development to the City, the County, and the Region.

Councilman Williams asked how this project would fit in with the Downtown Master Plan, specifically the business incubator.

Mrs. Baroody responded that the consultants that were hired to redo the Downtown Master Plan are overwhelmingly in favor of having a transit project downtown because it is a known generator of economic development and there would be space for a business incubator.

Councilwoman Williams-Blake supports the transit center downtown, but stated she could not vote for a letter of support today because she does not have enough information. Councilwoman Williams-Blake requested Mrs. Baroody provide her with a copy of the feasibility study and the application to see what Council is providing a letter of support for.

Mrs. Baroody will get a draft of the feasibility study to Council.

Mayor Wukela stated he felt there was support for the concept and support for the transit hub downtown but it will require a commitment from the city, the state and the county. Mayor Wukela would like to know that Sen. Leatherman's committee and the FLATS committee endorses this idea and would follow their lead on this.

Councilman Williams made a motion to grant the letter of support requested by Mrs. Baroody for a transit hub and to provide requested information on the project to councilmembers. Councilman Brand seconded the motion.

Voting in favor of granting the letter of support were Councilman Powers, Councilman Brand, Councilman Robinson, Councilman Williams and Councilman Bradham.

Voting in opposition were Councilwoman Williams-Blake and Mayor Wukela.

The motion passed 5-2.

Councilman Powers asked what the status was on a request that was made by Mrs. Baroody at the June 14th City Council meeting for an additional \$25,000 in funding.

Mayor Wukela stated that at the June 14th City Council meeting the 2010-2011 budget was passed by Council. A motion was made at that meeting to increase the allocation to PDRTA from \$35,000 to \$60,000. This motion failed. If Council decides to reconsider that element of the budget, it would be appropriate for a member who voted in the majority to make a motion for reconsideration.

Councilman Powers, who was in the majority, made a motion that Council reconsider the budget amendment decision to amend the current PDRTA allocation of \$35,000 to include a one-time increase of \$25,000, raising the allocation to \$60,000 to be used to receive matching funds. Councilman Bradham

seconded the motion.

Councilman Brand stated he did not support voting on this today and putting the pressure on the city manager to find an additional \$25,000 without giving the city manager a chance to look for a funding source. Councilman Brand would like for the city manager to look for the funds between now and the next council meeting and then vote on it. Councilman Brand stated that the County is not supporting this in any way and feels they should.

Mayor Wukela recommended taking this request along with other requests received in the past few months and reconsider them on a quarterly basis after Council has had an opportunity to re-evaluate the budget in light of information provided as far as what sales tax revenue has been and what the other revenues have been and what the City's expenses have been.

There being no further discussion, the Mayor called for vote on the motion to reconsider the budget amendment decision to amend the current PDRTA allocation of \$35,000 to include a one-time increase of \$25,000, raising the allocation to \$60,000 to be used to receive matching funds. Voting in favor were Councilman Powers, Councilman Robinson, Councilman Williams and Councilman Bradham.

Voting in opposition were Councilman Brand, Mayor Wukela and Councilwoman Octavia Williams-Blake.

The motion passed 4-3, and the budget ordinance for the 2010-2011 fiscal year was amended to increase the allocation for the PDRTA from \$35,000 to \$60,000.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS (TAKEN OUT OF ORDER)

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-02 (TO RECONSIDER) A RESOLUTION TO ADD VETERANS DAY TO THE LIST OF OFFICIAL HOLIDAYS FOR THE CITY OF FLORENCE.

A Resolution to add Veterans Day to the list of official holidays for the City of Florence was adopted by Council.

Mayor Wukela stated that this Resolution was denied at the June 14th regular City Council meeting. The rules of Council require that if a matter is to be reconsidered it must be reconsidered at the next regular meeting of City Council. A motion to reconsider must be made by a member that voted in the majority. Mayor Wukela stated he was in the majority that voted to not adopt Veterans Day as a City holiday and is not inclined to change his vote. Mayor Wukela stated he was requested by Councilman Bradham to make a motion to reconsider this matter so that Councilman Bradham will have additional opportunity to debate the matter and to present additional information to Council on this issue.

Mayor Wuklea made a motion to reconsider Resolution No. 2010-02. Councilman Bradham seconded the motion.

After providing Council with an additional report and information regarding Memorial and Veterans Day, Councilman Bradham requested Council to consider permanently naming November 11, as a Veterans Day holiday for the City of Florence. Veterans Day is currently recognized as a holiday by the state and federal government.

Voting in favor of adding Veterans Day as a City holiday were Councilman Powers, Councilman Robinson, Councilman Williams and Councilman Bradham.

Voting in opposition were Councilman Brand, Mayor Wukela and Councilwoman Williams-Blake.

The motion passed 4-3.

BREAK

There was unanimous consent to take a short break. Mayor Wukela recessed the meeting at 3:08 p.m. Mayor Wukela reconvened the meeting at 3:17 p.m.

ORDINANCES IN POSITION

BILL NO. 2010-22 - SECOND READING

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF A NOT TO EXCEED \$5,500,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND OF 2010 OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA, TO PRESCRIBE THE PURPOSES FOR WHICH THE PROCEEDS SHALL BE EXPENDED, TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF, AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

An Ordinance to provide for the issuance and sale of a not to exceed \$5,500,000 General Obligation Bond of 2010 of the City of Florence, South Carolina, to prescribe the purposes for which the proceeds shall be expended, to provide for the payment thereof, and other matters relating thereto was adopted on second reading.

Councilman Brand made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2010-22 on second reading. Councilman Powers seconded the motion.

Councilman Robinson asked the City Manager to list what the \$5.5 million would be spent on.

Mr. David Williams stated that the \$5.5 million would be used to construct Fire Station 5; \$290,000 for Levy Park improvements; downtown parking, underground utilities and streetscape expenses; new apparatus for Station 5; a replacement fire apparatus and a replacement ladder truck; a fire service truck; 2 replacement sanitation trucks; and other equipment related to the ISO fire needs.

There was a discussion regarding downtown parking and how this item may overlap with plans by PDRTA for a downtown parking garage. Councilman Robinson stated he would like to see efforts coordinated so that money is not wasted. The downtown parking associated with this issue would be for surface parking and not a parking deck.

Voting in favor of adopting Bill No. 2010-22 were Councilman Powers, Councilman Brand, Mayor Wukela, Councilman Williams, Councilman Bradham and Councilwoman Williams-Blake.

Voting in opposition was Councilman Robinson.

Bill No. 2010-22 was adopted with a vote of 6-1.

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES

BILL NO. 2010-23 – FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE PROPERTY OWNED BY PARKLAND DEVELOPMENT, 1306 W. EVANS STREET.

An Ordinance to rezone property owned by Parkland Development, 1306 W. Evans Street was passed on first reading.

Mr. Phillip Lookadoo, Director of Urban Planning and Development reported that this is a rezoning request for property located at 1306 W. Evans Street from B-1, Limited Business District to B-2, Convenience Business Commercial District. The property is shown more specifically on Florence

County Tax Map 90046-08-023. The request is being made by the owner, Mr. Jim Lyles for Parkland Development, LLC.

A Public Hearing for rezoning was held at the June 8, 2010 Planning Commission meeting. The Planning Commission members voted to approve the request with a vote of 6-2.

Councilman Brand made a motion to pass Bill No. 2010-23 on first reading. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-04

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AND ADOPTING A TAX ADVANTAGED BOND COMPLIANCE POLICY FOR THE CITY OF FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA.

A Resolution establishing and adopting a Tax Advantaged Bond Compliance Policy for the City of Florence, South Carolina was adopted by Council.

Mr. Thomas Chandler, Director of Finance reported that the City of Florence issues debt obligations that are eligible for certain tax benefits, either tax exempt bonds, and more recently, under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, the ability to have tax credits on taxable bonds.

State and Federal law have always required that tax advantaged bonds be maintained that certain actions and practices be followed through the life of the issue. Over the years, the City has adhered to those policies. What is being recommended by the City's bond counsel is to actually reduce those policies and practices to writing. Recently the IRS has expressed some interest with the Build America Bonds to understand more fully how entities are maintaining and complying with these policies. One of the best ways to reflect that is to simply formalize what the City does in writing. Council was provided a listing of policies that the City complies with and will continue to comply with. Other administrative procedures will also be implemented to reinforce these policies at the Finance Department level.

Councilman Brand made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2010-04. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

REPORTS TO COUNCIL

APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Councilman Powers stated he has concerns that some of the boards/commissions do not have applicant(s) to fill the vacancies and there are no statistics for attendance of the meetings or how long someone has served on a board or commission. Councilman Powers reviewed the requirements for serving on a board or commission and added he feels a number of people are being excluded. Councilman Powers suggested the following citizens be considered for appointment to a board or commission: 1) A business owner located in the City of Florence that may live in the County; 2) a property owner that owns property in the City of Florence but may live in the County and, 3) Someone that does not have a business in the City of Florence but are employed in the city of Florence and may live in the county. Also, Councilman Powers believed that there was a committee formed to review the applications before they came to council.

Councilwoman Octavia Williams-Blake responded that the committee was given the task to come up with a new application and a process. Councilwoman Williams-Blake added that if Council wanted to expand the duties of the committee, they could look at the applications and attendance records.

Mayor Wukela suggested giving the committee the authority to review those procedures and to interview those applying to serve on a board or commission and then make recommendations to Council as to 1) whether a change in our policy, as far as who is eligible to be a member, should be made, and; 2) who should be appointed to these various committees.

Mayor Wukela made a motion to hold over the current serving members until Council has an opportunity to resolve this issue and that this entire matter of these applications be referred to Councilwoman Williams-Blake's committee and ask the committee to report on whether there needs to be changes in the format of who is eligible to serve and what her committee's recommendations are after having done some sensitive fact-finding on applicants. Councilman Brand seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

AGREEMENT OF THE I-20 CORRIDOR ALLIANCE - MR. DAVID WILLIAMS

This item was discussed in Executive Session.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Councilman Brand made a motion to enter into Executive Session. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Council entered into Executive Session at 3:47 p.m.

Mayor Wukela reconvened the regular meeting at 5:03 p.m.

Mayor Wukela stated the first matter discussed in Executive Session pertained to a contractual matter. Specifically a request from Darlington County and the Town of Timmonsville with regard to establishing agreements regarding wholesale sale of water to those entities.

Councilman Williams made a motion to grant staff the authority to negotiate with those entities such agreements for approval by this Council. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Mayor Wukela stated the next matter discussed pertained to an agreement of the I-20 Corridor Alliance. This Alliance endeavors to develop the I-20 corridor industrially and commercially to the benefit of citizens along that corridor. The Alliance is requesting Florence City Council to invest in the Alliance in the amount of \$10,000 per year for the next three years. Florence County Council has not yet acted to invest in the Alliance.

Councilman Brand made a motion that this matter be deferred to such time that the City County Conference Committee has an opportunity to meet with County Council and measure their view on this matter. Councilwoman Williams-Blake seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

ADJOURNMENT

Councilman Brand made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.




Location Map 1306 W. Evans








ZONING MAP 1306 W. Evans







LAND USE PLAN CONFORMANCE

The current Land Use Plan classifies the property as High Economic Corridor (HEC). The current land use plan defines HEC as follows:

"The objective of the high intensity development corridor concept is to support continued development and economic strengthening of designated High Intensity Corridors, and to enhance the appearance, improve the safety, and retain the carrying capacity of such corridors."

ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR CONSIDERATION

1. What changes have, or are, occurring in the area to justify a change in zoning?

W. Evans is a commercial collector road and serves as a corridor into Central Downtown. The Comprehensive Plan recognizes the importance of business activities along this corridor. The existing zoning in the area allows limited and convenience business. This reflects the need for buffering high intensity commercial uses from the nearby residential neighborhoods while encouraging business services.

2. What are adjacent properties zoned, and what are adjacent land uses?

Properties to on the north side of W. Evans are zoned B-2, while the properties east and west of the subject are zoned B-1. The adjacent residential neighborhood to the south is zoned R-3.

3. What are development plans in the area — roads, schools, future commercial development, etc.?

There are no currently known existing or future projects within the immediate area.

4. Is there a reason the current land use cannot continue to be feasible as it now exists?

The south side of W. Evans, east of Sycamore and west of Edisto, is zoned B-1. By all accounts the existing zoning could effectively continue. However, ideally from a neighborhood concept a convenience business district would be an appropriate zoning designation for this corridor.

- 5. List some potential uses under existing zoning & proposed zoning.
 - **B-1 Limited Business District:** This district is intended to accommodate office, institutional, and residential uses in areas whose character is changing, or where such a mix of uses is appropriate. It is designed principally for use along major streets dominated by older houses in transition.
 - **B-2 Convenience Business District:** The intent of this district is to meet the commercial and service needs generated by nearby residential areas. Goods and services normally available in these districts are of the "convenience variety." The size of this district should relate to surrounding residential markets and the location should be at or near major intersections, in proximity to and/or on the periphery of residential areas.

B-1 and B-2 promote Finance Insurance & Real Estate (FIREA) type office based uses. B-2 allows for more residential support retail trade services type uses with a lower intensity than B-3 General Commercial.

6. Are any of these uses inappropriate for this location, and if so, why?

The north side of W. Evans is B-2 with adjacent R-4 Residential District to the north. It would not seem contrary to allow similar uses along both the north side and south side of W. Evans.

- 7. (a) What is applicant's stated reason for requesting zoning?

 The applicant is seeking a B-2 zoning to accommodate leasing for a beauty salon, which is a personal care service not permitted in B-1.
- 8. (a) What will be the benefits to the surrounding properties?

 That residents of the neighborhood could, via a pedestrian mode of transportation, receive neighborhood business type services such as a beauty salon.
 - (b) What will be the detriments to the surrounding properties? No negative aspects are foreseen, providing adequate buffering is provided.
- Is a traffic study required for this petition?
 No. This re-zoning application does meet The Land Subdivision Ordinance Sec 5.1 G. of projects the requiring a traffic studies
- 10. What does the purpose statement of the proposed zoning district say?
 - **B-2 Convenience Business District:** The intent of this district is to meet the commercial and service needs generated by nearby residential areas. Goods and services normally available in these districts are of the "convenience variety." The size of this district should relate to surrounding residential markets and the location should be at or near major intersections, in proximity to and/or on the periphery of residential areas.
- Will this proposal meet the intent of the above purpose statement?
 Yes. B-2 provides for more retail trade uses that accommodate an active downtown corridor.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of the zoning request to B-2 due to adjacent B-2 zoning, intent of the B-2 zoning district and proximity to a pedestrian oriented neighborhood as well as road frontage along a commercial collector.



Location Map 108 Guerry St.








ZONING MAP 108 Guerry St.








Future Land Use 108 Guerry St.

The area primarily consists of McLeod Regional Medical Center facilities. It is also surrounded by single-family residential, churches, and retail development. The McLeod center properties exist along some heavily traveled corridors, specifically Cheves and Palmetto Streets. Although McLeod Health is right outside the Downtown Redevelopment District, Cheves and Palmetto Streets (to the west of South Church Street), will undergo major changes as development associated with the Downtown Revitalization Plan continues to unfold.




