MEMBERS PRESENT: Mayor Wukela called the regular meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. with the following members present: Councilman William C. Bradham, Jr., Councilwoman Octavia Williams-Blake; Councilman Billy D. Williams, Councilman Edward Robinson, Councilman Frank J. Brand, II; and Councilman Stephen C. Powers.

INVOCATION

Councilman Billy D. Williams gave the invocation, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilman Brand made a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of August 9, 2010. Councilman Bradham seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Councilman Brand made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2010-24 on second reading. Councilman Bradham seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

BILL NO. 2010-25 - SECOND READING AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND PDD.09.03 TO INCL.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND PDD-09-03 TO INCLUDE AN ICU TOWER AND CONNECTING CONCOURSE.

An Ordinance to amend PDD-09-03 to include an ICU Tower and Connecting Concourse was adopted on second reading.

Councilman Brand made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2010-25 on second reading. Councilman Bradham seconded the motion.

Councilwoman Octavia Williams-Blake recused herself from the voting due to her relationship with McLeod Regional Medical Center.

Voting aye were Councilman Powers, Councilman Brand, Councilman Robinson, Mayor Wukela, Councilman Williams and Councilman Bradham.

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES

BILL NO. 2010-26 - FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA, FOR FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2010, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2011 TO PROVIDE FOR A REDUCTION OF OPERATING MILLAGE DUE TO COUNTYWIDE PROPERTY REASSESSMENT.

An Ordinance to amend the budget for the City of Florence, South Carolina, for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011 to provide for a reduction of operating millage due to countywide property reassessment was passed on first reading.

Mr. David Williams, City Manager reported this budget amendment relates to the reduction of millage based on reassessment. Once the reassessment process is completed, there is normally a reduction in millage because property values tend to increase in the community. As required by state law, the City must reduce the millage rate appropriately to avoid a windfall in property tax revenue. The City's current operating millage is 54.9 mills and is being reduced by 1.2 mills to a level of 53.7. This is for operating purposes only. More than a year ago Council agreed to a millage increase for capital purposes not to exceed 4 mills. Based on the scope of the projects that have been approved and are underway, along with the cost of the bids that been received, it was anticipated there would be a 3 mill increase instead of the 4 that was approved. The 3 mills of capital millage increase combined with the reduction of 1.2 mills for operating purposes results in a net increase of 1.8 mills in taxes for this year. For a net increase of 1.8 mills the City will continue operations at the same level and still be able to finance several capital projects like the new fire station, new equipment and improvements at some of the City's parks.

Councilman Brand made a motion to pass Bill No. 2010-26 on first reading. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

BILL NO. 2010-27 – FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2010, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2011.

An Ordinance to amend the budget for the City of Florence, South Carolina, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011 was passed on first reading.

Mr. David Williams, City Manager reported that the purpose of the amendment is to more closely align budgeted amounts with actual revenues and expenditures. There is a change in Sections 1 and 2 of the ordinance that was originally submitted to Council. This change occurred when the county auditor computed the required millage for debt service on the city's debt for capital projects. It is required in the calculations to include both principal and interest on the first year's debt service. Only the interest portion was originally included and to bring it into line with the auditor's calculations, a change was needed in the ordinance that was originally submitted. These new calculations relate to the two debt issues that the city completed this year. The first debt issue is the revenue bond sale for the wastewater treatment plant project and the second debt issue is the general obligation bond sale for the capital projects. The numbers in Section 1 and 2 of this ordinance would amend the current year's budget to make sure the City has the correct and final figures for purposes of the budget to pay the debt service on these two bond issues.

Councilman Brand made a motion to pass Bill No. 2010-27 on first reading. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Mayor Wukela requested, that if there were no objections, for Council to consider these three Resolutions at one time. There was no objection from Council.

Councilman Brand made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2010-07, Resolution No. 2010-08 and Resolution No. 2010-09. Councilman Powers seconded the motion,

By unanimous vote Resolutions 2010-07, 2010-08 and 2010-09 were approved.

REPORTS TO COUNCIL

a. Appointments to Boards and Commissions

Councilwoman Williams-Blake, Chairman of the Committee for Boards and Commissions, presented a summary of the committee's meeting as it relates to appointments to city boards and commissions. Committee members Councilman Buddy Brand, Councilman Ed Robinson and Councilwoman Williams-Blake met on August 26, 2010. The following recommendations were presented to Council as relates to Boards and Commissions:

Once a person is appointed to a Board or Commission, request that the City Manager:

- 1) Issue a certificate to the person appointed notifying them of their appointment, their appointment date and expiration date and that a record of the appointments are kept.
- 2) Publicize vacancies, expired terms and terms expiring within 3 months.
- Information will be kept in a data base covering term information, qualifications needed, attendance and the way in which members are appointed.
- 4) Develop written guidelines for Boards and Commissions.
- 5) Keep Council abreast of upcoming appointments, resignations, etc.

Councilman Robinson recommended, and the Committee agreed, a new process for appointing members to Boards and Commission. When a vacancy occurs, on a rotating basis, each Council member will be responsible for nominating a member of the public to serve on the designated Board or Commission. The nominee must be confirmed by a majority of Council. The City Manager or his designee will be responsible for keeping Council informed of whose appointment would be coming up and when the appointment is about to expire.

The Committee would also like to institute a new orientation process for boards and commission members. The City Manager would provide an orientation on city government, rules and responsibilities of board/commission members; conflicts of interest guidelines; the board will be requested to submit meeting summaries to Council within 20 days of their meeting; and how a board/commission member can be removed from a board or commission; and how a member can resign from a board or commission.

The City Manager's office will coordinate vacancies that occur because of early resignation of a board/commission member. The positions will be advertised for at least 10 days and applications sent to City Council members. The City Manager will inform Council and the designated Councilmember of his/her nomination turn. The new member(s) will be selected at the next convenient City Council meeting.

The committee did not recommend changing the rules and regulations as relates to the qualifications of members. The rules are as follows:

*All persons appointed to any board or commission shall be residents of the city except in those cases where professional qualifications are required for a position and, in the council's opinion, there are no acceptable and qualified residents to fill the vacancy.

Councilwoman Williams-Blake stated that Council's next actions would be:

- *Read over the guidelines that have just been presented and vote on the proposed changes at the October meeting.
- *Designate a due date for the City Manager's report on current vacancies and Council appointments/rotation schedule.
- *Designate a meeting for nominations and voting on current vacancies to Board and Commissions.

Council instructed Mr. Jim Peterson, City Attorney, to format these changes into an Ordinance for Council to vote on at the October City Council meeting.

Also, the City Manager will provide Council the report on current vacancies and the rotation schedule and a recommendation on a date to vote on the vacancies.

b. Agreement of the I-20 Corridor Alliance

Mr. David Williams, City Manager reported this was originally brought before Council in July and no action was taken. It is on today's agenda at the request of Councilman Robinson. Mr. Williams stated he would like to clarify one point that was not made at the July meeting in reference to the funding for this agreement. The request for funding of up to \$10,000 per year for three years would only apply in the event that certain start up costs were incurred. The Alliance is not asking for an appropriation or an amount to be paid out; it would only be in the event that there were start up costs that would need to be shared by each of the member organizations. Mr. Williams added that as of today, Kershaw County, Lee County and Darlington County have all voted to join the alliance and the City of Columbia is pending at the present time.

Councilman Robinson stated the main purpose of the alliance is to provide means of growth and development along that I-20 corridor from Florence to Columbia. This could be a means of creating jobs and revenue for the City of Florence.

Councilman Robinson made a motion to approve this request. Councilman Williams seconded the motion.

The Board of the Alliance would consist of the Mayor and Chairman of County Council, or their designee appointed by the corresponding political jurisdiction.

Following a discussion by Council, Councilman Brand made a motion to amend to provide that Council send a designee for the formation of the entity without committing any funding until the entity has been formed and a designee reports back to Council. Councilman Bradham seconded the motion.

Mayor Wukela amended the motion further to name Councilman Brand to be City Council's designee to go and be a part of the formation of the entity. Councilwoman Williams-Blake seconded the amendment.

There was a unanimous consent from Council on this amendment.

Voting aye on the principal motion as amended were Councilman Powers, Councilman Brand, Councilman Robinson, Mayor Wukela, Councilman Williams, Councilman Bradham and Councilwoman Williams-Blake.

c. A report by Chief Anson Shells regarding a security camera system that could be used in various locations in the City of Florence.

Chief Anson Shells reported that at the August City Council meeting, Inspector Allen Heidler presented Council with preliminary information on a camera system that the Police Department has been considering pursuing. After looking at systems that would serve both short and long term needs, the best option appears to be a camera system known as the Netvision Mobile Camera System. This is a completely wireless system that reaches 30' above ground with two independent cameras that can be controlled locally or remotely over the Internet, has automatic motion detection capability, infrared capability, night vision, pans 360 ° and tilts 180°, which would provide a full range of coverage with no blind spots, solar powered, and can operate 17 to 22 days before needing a recharge, 250 GB hard drive storage, records 24 hours a day, stores data up to 9 days before looping, can be monitored in patrol vehicles through the Internet, and has online GPS tracking. The system can be used at numerous events throughout the City. For example, the Pecan Festival, May Fly event, events held in the City's parks, construction site monitoring, and can be used to monitor certain traffic intersections. The cost of the system is \$33,482.

Councilman Robinson stated that as relates to the cost of the system, County Councilmen Al Bradley and Waymon Mumford have agreed to help with the financing of the system.

Mayor Wukela stated that the next steps would be for the City to schedule a public meeting, and also, if Council approves, a meeting of the City-County Conference Committee to discuss the funding commitment from the County and then present to Council for a final decision.

d. A report by Councilman Robinson regarding the City of Florence travel policy.

Councilman Robinson stated he feels the Council travel policy is too strict and limits the growth of councilmembers to progress as relates to state and national affairs. He stated the proposed changes to the current policy are not asking for the approved budget to be exceeded by anyone but is a means of allowing other council members to have access to funds that have been appropriated to other council members that will not be used.

Councilman Robinson made a motion to adopt the changes as presented. Councilman Williams seconded the motion.

Changes discussed were: 1) Allow members to allow another member to use a portion of budgeted funds and 2) allow up to \$100 per day per diem. The per diem option would eliminate Council members submitting receipts for reimbursement of meals.

Councilman Brand made a motion to defer voting on this issue until after the November election. Councilman Powers seconded the motion.

Voting aye in favor of deferring were Councilman Powers, Councilman Brand, Mayor Wukela, Councilman Bradham and Councilwoman Williams-Blake.

Voting no was Councilman Robinson and Councilman Williams.

The motion to defer carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mayor Wukela stated an Executive Session was scheduled to discuss a contractual matter.

Councilman Brand made a motion to enter into Executive Session. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Council entered into Executive Session at 2:40 p.m.

Mayor Wukela reconvened the regular meeting at 3:18 p.m.

Mayor Wukela stated Council discussed a contractual matter in Executive Session. No action was taken in Executive Session.

DEPARTMENT/DIVISION: City Council

I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION

An ordinance to amend Section 2-40 of the City Code in order to put into place a clear and concise statement regarding the qualifications and standards of conduct for individuals appointed to boards and commissions of the city and to change and formalize the selection process for such boards and commissions.

II. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN

The attached proposed Ordinance is designed to incorporate the suggestions made by the committee of City Council assigned the task of studying our boards and commissions and making suggestions for changes to and clarification of the system presently used. This amendment of Section 2-40 of the City Code was provided to all members of Council at the regular meeting in September, 2010.

III. POINTS TO CONSIDER

- 1. This amended ordinance makes two significant changes to the present ordinance as follows:
 - (a) In subsection (1) it codifies the qualifications required for individuals to serve on Boards and Commissions appointed by the City.
 - (b) In subsection (2) it specifies a new method governing the nominations and election of individuals to Boards and Commissions by

establishing a rotation system for nominations and clarifying that the election of such individuals will be by majority of City Council.

2. In addition to these changes, this amendment also codifies the responsibilities of Council and the City Manager in the administration of the selection process in order to insure its smooth operation. One duty assigned to the City Manager is the maintenance of a spreadsheet specifying the nomination rotation for each board and commission. A copy of the spreadsheet is attached.

IV. STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff stands ready to carry out the wishes of Council.

WHEREAS, it is the desire of Council to amend the ordinance which governs the Boards and Commissions in order change and clarify the qualifications for service on the Boards and Commissions, the standards of conduct for such service, and the method to be used by City Council in making appointments to the Boards and Commissions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Florence, at a meeting duly assembled and by the authority thereof, as follows:

1. Section 2-40 of the City Code is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Sec. 2-40. Qualifications, Standards of Conduct and Selection of Members.

The following rules and regulations shall govern the qualifications, conduct and selection of members appointed to the regulatory and advisory boards and commissions of the city, except as specifically provided in other sections of this code or in applicable state statutes:

(1) All boards or commissions shall be composed of the specific number of members as designated by city council or by state law. Each member shall be either a resident of the city, a representative of a business or other organization located or operating within the city, or a non resident having professional qualifications which are required for a position and, in the council's opinion, there are no acceptable and qualified residents to fill the vacancy. Members of the boards and commissions shall be appointed in consideration of their professional expertise, knowledge of the community, and concern for the future welfare of the total community and its citizens. Membership shall represent a broad cross section of the interests and concerns of persons residing and doing business within the city. At all times, the majority of the members of any board or commission shall be residents of the city unless otherwise specifically provided by statute.

- (2) In selecting members of boards and commissions, city council shall follow the following nomination and election process:
 - (a) A nomination rotation shall be established for each board or commission in which each member of city council shall be assigned the exclusive right to nominate the person to fill the next available seat on the respective board or commission, the rotation on all boards or commissions to be set out in a spreadsheet prepared by the city manager and followed until such time as this ordinance is amended.
 - (b) Whenever it is time to select a member of any board or commission, the city council member assigned the nomination under the spreadsheet shall make the nomination, and city council shall vote on the nominee. If the nominee receives the approval of a majority, said nominee shall be appointed. If the nominee does not receive the approval of a majority, then the same city council member assigned the nomination under the spreadsheet shall make another nomination. This same process will continue until a nominee of the city council member assigned the nomination receives approval of a majority.
- (3) It shall be the responsibility of the city manager to keep city council informed of vacancies on the boards and commissions and to keep records concerning the current status of the nominations spreadsheet referenced above. The current spreadsheet shall be a public record available upon request.
- (4) No member of the immediate family of any member of the city council shall be appointed to a city board or commission.
- (5) Except when otherwise required by statute or ordinance, fifty (50) per cent or more of all members of city boards and commissions shall be members whose businesses or professions are not related directly to the affairs conducted by the board

or commission to which such persons are appointed.

- (6) All positions on all boards and commissions, when up for selection for any reason, shall be advertised by the office of the city manager for at least ten (10) days. When applications are received by the office of the city manager from members of the public, the city manager will inform all members of council of all applications.
- 2. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its approval and adoption by the City Council of the City of Florence.

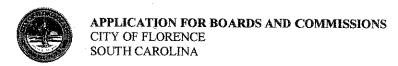

Date: October 18, 2010

The Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee held meetings in August and September 2010 for the purpose of receiving and evaluating Accommodations Tax funding requests for fiscal year 2010-2011. Requests were received from nineteen (19) organizations requesting "65% funds" and one (1) organization requesting "30% funding.

The Committee has studied these requests carefully, closely examining the critical needs expressed by the representatives of the requesting agencies, and evaluating the impact these agencies have on the tourism in the Florence community.

Preliminary projections indicate that approximately \$325,000 of the "65% funds" will be available for allocation to requesting agencies and an additional \$126,000 for tourism promotion in the "30% funds."

The Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee is again recommending to City Council that the 2010-2011 appropriations to the various arts organizations be routed through the Florence Area Arts Alliance to enable that organization to receive additional grant funding through the South Carolina Arts Commission. The Florence Area Arts Alliance will then disburse the Accommodations Tax funds directly to the funded arts organizations in the amounts appropriated by City Council. This arrangement enables the Arts Alliance to substantially increase its level of grant funding from the South Carolina Arts Commission for its Small Grants Program which benefits a large number of arts organizations in the Florence area. The organizations which will be funded in this manner include: The Masterworks Choir, Florence Little Theatre, eBushua Foundation, Florence Symphony Orchestra, Florence Museum, Sankofa Festival, SC Dance Theatre, and the Arts International Festival in addition to the independent funding of the Florence Area Arts Alliance.

Attached you will find the Accommodations Tax Request for FY 2010-2011 report listing all organizations requesting funds for this year; the amount of funding received by these organizations for FY 2009-10; the amount of funds actually requested by the organizations for FY 2010-11; and the recommendations of the Advisory Committee (Attachment 1). You will also find attached an Accommodations Tax Financial Report for fiscal year ending June 30, 2010 (Attachment 2). In addition, an Accommodations Tax Projection of Receipts for FY 2010-11 is included for your information (Attachment 3). Also enclosed is a copy of the public notice printed in the local newspaper providing information concerning application for Accommodations Tax Funding (Attachment 4).
