Looking ahead, Florence remains committed to advancing its role in the Sports Tourism Industry. Plans include the development of a new four-field multi-purpose complex and the expansion of the Pearl Moore Basketball Center to include an arena-style basketball facility. These expansions aim not only to elevate Florence as a top sporting events destination but also to promote economic prosperity through increased tourism and hospitality revenues.

The economic impact of these efforts has been substantial, exceeding \$10.6 million for the 2023-2024 fiscal year alone, driven by over 37,000 visitors to Florence. With a projected return on investment expected within six years, Florence is positioned to reinvest in future projects that will foster long-term growth and enrich the community.

Through these initiatives, Florence exemplifies its dedication to enhancing the quality of life for all residents, promoting inclusivity, accessibility, and fostering community engagement.
